



William Shakespeare (26 April 1564– 23 April 1616) was an English poet and playwright, widely regarded as the greatest writer in the English language and the world's pre-eminent dramatist. He is often called England's national poet and the "Bard of Avon". His extant works, including some collaborations, consist of about 38 plays, 154 sonnets, two long narrative poems, and a few other verses, the authorship of some of which is uncertain. His plays have been translated into every major living language and are performed more often than those of any other playwright.

William Shakespeare's plays have the reputation of being among the greatest in the English language and in Western literature. Traditionally, the 38 plays are divided into the genres of tragedy, history, and comedy; they have been translated into every major living language, in addition to being continually performed all around the world. Many of his plays appeared in print as a series of quartos, but approximately half of them remained unpublished until 1623, when the posthumous First Folio was published. The traditional division of his plays into tragedies, comedies and histories follows the categories used in the First Folio. However, modern criticism has labelled some of these plays "problem plays" that elude easy categorisation, or perhaps purposely break generic conventions, and has introduced the term romances for what scholars believe to be his later comedies. When Shakespeare first arrived in London in the late 1580s or early 1590s, dramatists writing for London's new commercial playhouses (such as The Curtain) were combining two different strands of dramatic tradition into a new and distinctively Elizabethan synthesis. Previously, the most common forms of popular English theatre were the Tudor morality plays. These plays, celebrating piety generally, use personified moral attributes to urge or instruct the protagonist to choose the virtuous life over Evil. The characters and plot situations are largely symbolic rather than realistic. As a child, Shakespeare would likely have seen this type of play (along with, perhaps, mystery plays and miracle plays). The other strand of dramatic tradition was classical aesthetic theory. This theory was derived ultimately from Aristotle; in Renaissance England, however, the theory was better known through its Roman interpreters and practitioners. At the universities, plays were staged in a more academic form as Roman closet dramas. These plays, usually performed in Latin, adhered to classical ideas of unity and decorum, but they were also more static, valuing lengthy speeches over physical action. Shakespeare would have learned this theory at grammar school, where Plautus and especially Terence were key parts of the curriculum and were taught in editions with lengthy theoretical introductions.





Statehood Day of Bosnia and Herzegovina

Statehood Day is a public holiday in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In the Federation (the Bosniak-Croat entity), 25 November is celebrated as Statehood Day.

On this day in 1943, the Anti-Fascist Council of Bosnia and Herzegovina (ZAVNOBiH) adopted a resolution declaring Bosnia and Herzegovina an equal community of Serbs, Muslims and Croats.



- * **The first session ZAVNOBIH (National Anti-Fascist Council of National Liberation of Bosnia and Herzegovina) was held on 25th November 1943 in Mrkonjic Grad.**
- * **At the meeting it was decided to renew BiH statehood, its historical borders were confirmed (which have been dated back to the times of medieval Bosnia), and Bosnia and Herzegovina was defined as one of the six equal republics of the former Yugoslavia.**
- * **On 25th November 1943 Bosnia and Herzegovina renewed its statehood, which was lost in 1463, when Bosnia came under the administration of the Ottoman Empire.**



International Human Rights Day

'All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights', says the first article of Universal Declaration of Human Rights. With its birth and with the first moments of its life man has his human rights. They are guaranteed, inalienable and regulated by row of international documents.

Human Rights Day is celebrated annually across the world on 10 December every year. It commemorates the day on which, in 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights at the Palais de Chaillot, Paris. The Declaration arose directly from the experience of the Second World War and represents the first global expression of what many people believe to be the rights to which all human beings are inherently entitled. It consists of thirty articles. In addition it is traditionally on 10 December that the five-yearly United Nations Prize in the Field of Human Rights and Nobel Peace Prize are awarded.

To commemorate this day many governmental and non-governmental organizations schedule special events and activities. For example, the theme for 2016 was *'Stand up for someone's rights today!'*.



Abraham Lincoln (1809-1865) was president of United States during the American civil war. He made the famous Emancipation Proclamation declaring *'that all persons held as slaves'*.

Anna Eleanor Roosevelt (1884-1962) was an American politician, diplomat and activist. She was the First Lady of the United States from March 1933 to April 1945 during her husband President Franklin D. Roosevelt was four terms in office. Eleanor also served as United States Delegate to the United Nations General Assembly from 1945 to 1952. Later they called her the *'First Lady of the World'* in tribute to her human rights achievements.



Nelson Mandela (1918-2013) was anti-apartheid leader. Mandela spent over 20 years in prison for his opposition to the racist apartheid system which excluded blacks from many areas of society.



Martin Luther King Jr. (1929-1968) was an American Baptist minister and activist who was a leader in the Civil Rights Movement. On October 14, 1964, he received the Nobel Peace Prize for combating racial inequality through nonviolent resistance. He is also famous because of his 'I have a dream' speech.


Some of our students also joined this program in the period of March 6th to March 11th, participating in different activities and workshops together with guest from Hong Kong.



A Film Review

Hachi: A Dog's Tale

Hachi: A Dog's Tale is 2009 drama film based on a true story. It's directed by Lasse Hallström and screenplayed by Stephen P. Lindsey. Hachi's owner was played by Richard Gere.



The real Hachi lived in Japan and on May 19, 2012, he got a bronze statue because of the loyalty to his owner. The first adaptation of this story was called *Hachiko Monogatari* and was filmed in Japan in 1987.

This movie is a real story about love between a dog and a man. Hachi would sit in front of the station every day, waiting for his owner to come from work. After the owner's death, Hachi continued waiting. He spent the last nine years of his life at the station until he died there.

The film received mostly positive reviews from critics. Review aggregator *Rotten Tomatoes*, reported that 62% of critics gave the film positive reviews with an average rating of 5.8/10.

The plot is interesting, but movie is pretty monotonous. It probably couldn't be better because there aren't any excitments in the story. So is it worth watching? If you are a sensitive soul, animal-lover or you're just lacking sadness in your life- then yes, you should definitely watch it. But if you are anything else but that then step away.

As for the music, editing and production- it's not that bad. Hallström truly captured this dog's-eye view of life. But every visual projection of a story should keep you interested, excite you and make you watch it again. This movie is worth watching once. But I would recommend it to children because it's a perfect family movie.

PEACE


A dark hand touching a light hand,

Cette année, dans notre lycée nous avons organisé:







Bruno Nicolini, dit Bénabar, né le 16 juin 1969 à Thiais (Val-de-Marne), est un chanteur, acteur français et dramaturge.



*Bénabar grandit à Saintry-sur-Seine, en Essonne, dans la banlieue parisienne. Sa mère italienne est libraire et son père corse est régisseur pour le cinéma et a fait au moins une cinquantaine de films. À huit ans, il s'initie à la trompette, parce que cela est symbolique des clowns et du cirque qui l'impressionnent, et par goût musical. Bruno Nicolini est régisseur adjoint sur *Le Brasier* (1991), puis réalise trois courts-métrages : *Nada Lezard* (1991), *Sursum corda* (1994) et *José Jeannette* (1992). Il a été nommé aux Victoires de la musique 2003 dans la catégorie « Révélation » (prix remporté par *Natasha Saint-Pier*) et « Révélation scène »*

*(prix remporté par *Sanseverino*), puis en 2004, il remporte le prix du meilleur album de chansons/variétés avec son album *Les Risques du métier*. Le 10 mars 2007, lors de la vingt-deuxième cérémonie des Victoires de la musique 2007, il reçoit les récompenses du groupe ou artiste interprète masculin de l'année et de la chanson originale de l'année*

La musique est quant à elle plutôt simple, avec une forte présence de cuivres façon fanfare, alternant avec des morceaux de piano accompagnés par la voix de Bénabar. Son dernier album s'est enrichi de nouveaux instruments, tels le trombone ou la contrebasse, modifiant ainsi le rythme des chansons et renforçant leur côté jazz.

*Bénabar déploie sur scène une grande énergie. Il aime émailler ses spectacles de petits sketches et de plaisanteries.
